STRUCTURE OF ATOMIC NUCLEI

PROTONS AND NEUTRONS

FACTORS AFFECTING NUCLEAR STABILITY

MAGIC NUMBERS AND NUCLEAR SHELL MODEL

NUCLEAR SIZE AND INSTABILITY

HALF-LIFE AND DECAY CHAINS
